The Table for Maundy Thursday

Arrival and Informal Greeting

Greeting and Invitation to the Table

Pastor: Why is this night different from all others? On this night Jesus desired to celebrate the Passover meal in Jerusalem.

He said to his friends: "I will not eat it again until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

People: On this night, Jesus the Lamb of God gave himself into the hands of those who would kill him.

Pastor: On this night Jesus took a towel and washed the disciples' feet, giving us an example that we should do to others as he has done to us.

All: On this night, Jesus blessed and broke the bread of life. Jesus poured out his blood to take away the sin of the world. Jesus gave us a holy feast to bless what is broken, to forgive what is sin, to make all things new. Thanks be to God.

Pastor: Thanks be to God for daily bread, for loving hands which prepared these tables and this meal. Grant us refreshment of body and soul as we gather in Jesus' name. Amen.

The Fellowship Meal

Gospel Lesson - John 13: 1-17, 33-35

Pastor: Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father.

People: Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

Pastor: The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot to betray Jesus. Knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands and that he had come from God and was going to God, Jesus got up from the table took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel. He came to Simon Peter who said to him:

People: “Lord, are you going to wash my feet?”

Pastor: Jesus answered, “You do not know what I am doing now, but later you will understand.”

People: “You will never wash my feet”

Pastor: “Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.”

**People: “Lord, not my feet only,
but also my hands and my head!”**

Pastor: “One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet. And you are clean, though not all of you. Jesus said this for he knew who was to betray him. After Jesus had washed their feet, he put on his robe and returned to the table saying: “Do you know what I have done to you” You call me Teacher and Lord and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have set you an example, that you should do as I have done. Servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them” I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.

People: By this everyone will know that we are Christ’s disciples, if we have love for one another.

Prayer of Confession

Pastor: Holy Jesus, we have promised to live as your disciples, yet we confess that we have not loved you or one another with our whole heart.

**People: We have sinned in what we have done
and in what we have failed to do.**

Pastor: We do not work together as one to your glory.

**People: Receive us and forgive us that we may commit
ourselves anew to live out the love you have shown to us.
Lord, have mercy.**
